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TIPS & IDEAS

- Download, print, laminate & cut out words.
- Read together & sort into nouns & verbs.
- You may want to begin using only the words your child can read.
- Match the words that look similar & talk about: how they look the same & how they look different.
- Choose one noun & one verb. Read & talk about how the words sound together. Nonsense pairings are fine as long as there is a Noun/Verb agreement.
- After the 2 words are in agreement, have your child complete the sentence or thought ~ again, accept nonsense sentences.
For example: A trees likes to look tall.
- You can, also, talk about categories, like living & nonliving things, school things, body parts, things that grow, etc.
- See if your child can put a few words in ABC order, too.
